

Book Clubs are the heart of libraries. T.B. Scott Free Library is no exception. The Cover-to-Cover Book Club has offered an active connection to books every month since 1997. Let's do the math:

26 years x 12 months per year = 312 books

That is a lot of books read and discussed over the years! With the recent emergence of virtual meetings and presentations, the authors themselves will sometimes join in on the discussion. Book selections vary from month to month with fiction and non-fiction titles.

In 2023, the library began expanding book club offerings with the creation of the **B**ring **Y**our **O**wn **B**ook (BYOB) Club and opened its meeting spaces for area book clubs to gather. To the Gen Z's and Millennials in the community, we know you are out there. What will bring you to a Book Club at the Library? It is certain that there will be more opportunities for more book clubs in 2024.

### **LITERACY PARTNERSHIPS**










Promote and encourage community members of all ages to discover the joy of reading and to become lifelong readers.

# PROMOTING-SUPPORTING-SERVING

# **GEARING UP FOR THE** 2024-2028 STRATEGIC PLAN

The end of 2023 brought to an end the Library's 2018-2023 Strategic Plan. In June 2023, the process to reevaluate the Library's position among similar-size libraries based upon its physical size and the population of the community began with the Library Administrative Team visiting libraries throughout the state. We evaluated spaces and met with staff with questions in hand to ensure productive conversations. In September, the Library team worked to develop a Community Survey that residents throughout our area could complete. Questions related to resident experiences with the Library, their interest in what the library currently provided, and what they wished to be considered in the future. The data from the Survey has been extrapolated and a report is on file at the Library that the public is welcome to review. The Library team was then set to the task of developing the Goals & Objectives for the 2024-2028 Strategic Plan, The completion of this step is set for April 2024 at which time it will be presented to the Board of Trustees for



approval. Check back for the review of the final steps in the process in the 2024 Annual Report. We are excited to see what the next five years brings to the Library and its patrons.

# **WE ARE YOUR DEMENTIA-FRIENDLY LIBRARY**

Learning is a journey not a destination. And, the Library is one of the best places to put that into practice. Staff Development Days were developed and play a critical role in supporting and preparing the library team to provide the best service possible to the members of our community. Through a partnership with the Aging & Disability Resource Center, we brought the training to the Library team to help us earn the designation of a Dementia Friendly Library.

# VALUED ADDITION TO THE LIBRARY THROUGH COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

In an effort to meet the needs of all community members the Library continuously adds resources that enhance the library experience. In 2023, the Library was fortunate to receive a donation for an updated low-vision desktop device from Midstate Independent Living Choices (MILC). This resource is available to patrons on the 3rd floor in the Adult Services Department. While the unit is located in the Adult Services Department, it is available to library patrons of all ages. Individuals interested in learning more about the low-vision device and how it works may schedule an appointment.

Individuals familiar with the use of the equipment may stop in any time to use it. We are always looking for more ways to make the library experience more about the patrons who use it.



# BRINGING NEW AND UPDATED TECH TOOLS FOR YOU

Always striving to improve the patron experience and developing a collection that patrons will enjoy, in 2023 the Library invested in new Youth Services



work stations. Purchase of this form of equipment can be made through the cost-savings made available through a statewide purchasing consortium. In layman's terms, "We get more bang for our buck through volume purchases." What you are seeing in the image of books is audio books with the audio feature built right right into the book structure. No longer does a reader need a separate tape



or a CD player to listen to a book. It's right there in their hands in the book for their listening pleasure and to read along developing their literacy skills with a feeling of independence.

# MORE THAN JUST BOOKS...ELEMENTALLY SPEAKING





Libraries have transformed and libraries are more than just books. The Library has branched out and is offering more programs devoted to the interests of community members and continues to expand the Library of Things that was first developed in 2018. After five years of expansion, the Library of Things relocated to the first floor in a space of its own. The relocation offers patrons the opportunity



to view the items available for check out more closely. The addition of an assortment of cake pans was by far the largest development in the Library of Things collection in 2023. Patrons may request the cake of their choice at the Circulation Desk after browsing through the Cake Binder on display.

## Space Needs Study

After being rescheduled numerous times since 2018, for reasons beyond Library control, the Library's contracted Space Needs Study with MSR Design, Architecture firm from Minneapolis, MN, began in January 2023. The Library administration team met numerous times with the MSR Design Team. A Plan was put in place and focus group meetings were scheduled and held in February 2023. The Final Report, which is available for public viewing, stressed numerous areas of concern, one of which was the need for additional meeting & activity spaces. Libraries have transformed over the years along with the needs of community members. A recommendation was made by Library administration to the Library Board of Trustees that the addition of a meeting/activity room in the Youth Services Department be made to allow for increased programming and greater support of community needs. The decision was made to pursue the addition in 2024. Stay tuned for more in 2024.
