



Friends, Lovers, and the Big Terrible Thing by Matthew Perry

I was a huge fan of the sitcom "Friends" like so many others and an even greater fan of "Chandler." He was funny and could make you laugh every time he would appear in a scene. Reading his autobiography posthumously strongly tugged at my heart strings. I became aware of his struggle with drugs and alcohol somewhere down the line but had no idea the daily battle he faced. Sitting down to physically read a book does not work in my schedule so I often choose to listen to audiobooks. This one, by far, was the best as it was read by Matthew Perry, himself. I think what hit me the hardest was one of the first sentences I heard him say, "Hi, my name is Matthew, although you may know me by another name. My friends call me Matty. And I should be dead," because as I mentioned at the beginning of my review, he was already deceased. If you want to understand the struggle anyone faces with addiction, I strongly suggest you check out the book from the library or go to Libby and listen to "his voice" tell "his story."
